Year 8 Rugby Sparkling

On Wednesday afternoon this week our nearest neighbours, Garth Olwg brought their Year 8 Rugby Team over to face the black and blue of Bryn Celynnog. It proved to be a bruising encounter.

With a firm pitch and dry ball, there was hunger for a feast of running rugby. It was an inauspicious start for the home team though and after a few minutes of early possession turnovers Garth Olwg's Goliath of a number 8 Forward brushed aside a few half-hearted home team tackles to open the scoring. The effect of going behind seemed to clear the minds of the Bryn boys and a Davidic response ensued.

For the rest of the game Bryn Celynnog took total control. Quiet confidence seemed to flow through the players and they trusted their skills and trusted each other to outplay the visitors.

Garth Olwg seemed rocked by the response and were unable to develop any coherent teamwork, relying on individuals. The rest of the first half saw a steady stream of tries for Bryn Celynnog. Ollie George and Owen Lewis, the half backs, directed the play and a steady stream of possession was guaranteed for them by a solid performance from the pack. The outside backs enjoyed themselves with silky running from Lewis Owtrim, strong carries from Alfie Abercrombie and great footwork from Joe Evans.

The forwards, led by captain Alex Ballinger worked solidly and turnovers were regularly completed by Evan Baker at 8 and the captain himself. Jai Adams played solidly, often at first or second receiver providing links between phases of play. A few boys played

out of position due to injuries to a couple of regular starters and they completed their roles very well. A few rucks could have been more fully staffed but it was a dominant effort from the pack.

The second half saw the pattern continue as Bryn Celynnog were ruthless in their pursuit of quality rugby. Garth Olwg managed a few incursions into the home team's territory and did come away with another try. They never stopped chasing and did force the Bryn Celynnog to higher levels of performance. The catch and pass quality was incredible from the home team with only one knock on marring a great handling display.

There are "work ons" for this develop team though, the kick receipt was disorganised and hectic and the lines out and rucks could do with some fine tuning. The team now moves on to face Y Pant in the Pontypridd Schools Cup final next month, where they will no doubt face a sterner test.

A fantastic performance on Wednesday afternoon though with every single squad member contributing fully, they all deserve a mention:

All pupils at Bryn Celynnog have access to the latest Microsoft Office applications as well as other cloud-based services. Microsoft Office 365 is your Office in the cloud! It will allow you to create, collaborate, edit, communicate and save school work as well as homework on your online space.

You will be able to access work on a range of devices, including PCs, laptops, tablets and smart phones. Microsoft 365 can be accessed at home, in school or on the go, provided you have an internet connection. ClassCharts

Pupil Accounts

Pupils have been given access to their own account, which they will be able to log into via a computer/mobile phone app or by speaking with their Form Tutor.

Once a pupil has logged into their account they will be able to see their behaviour points and have access to the Reward Store, where they can purchase rewards online with the positive points they have collected.

Rewards Store

Rewards are an acknowledgement of pupils' hard work and effort both in the classroom and around the school. There is a constant expectation that all pupils will be praised and rewarded. Pupils will be notified when they receive positive points by their classroom teacher and can monitor their score via the ClassCharts website or App. Positive points also link directly to the Rewards Store in ClassCharts. Pupils can purchase their chosen item from the app and collect it in school. The current list of available items is listed in the Rewards Store.

Parent Account

ClassCharts Behaviour Management

We have a very clear behaviour management system in place, which your child should already be aware of. Members of staff follow this system to deal with poor behaviour in lessons to ensure effective learning is able to take place. A range of consequences and sanctions are in place for pupils who do not uphold our simple and achievable expectations:

- D1** - This is issued to a pupil when a member of staff has to speak to them regarding their behaviour in lesson. The pupil is told that they are now on a D1.
- D2** - This is issued when a pupil has been moved to a new seat due to persistent poor behaviour. This is the second time a teacher has had to speak to a pupil during the lesson.
- D3** - This is issued when a pupil has had to be spoken to for the third time about their behaviour. This may be issued if a pupil is consistently disrupting the class/not following instructions or continued poor behaviour. When a D3 is issued the Head of Faculty will remove the pupil from the lesson.
- D4** - Pupils who proceed through sanctions D1 – D3 and fail with the Head of Faculty intervention are sent to the D4L room and issued a D4.

Removal to Discipline for Learning (D4L) room will be immediate for:-

- Serious behaviour out of lessons
- Verbal abuse
- Behaviour towards others which is considered dangerous
- Damage to, or theft of, school property or that of others.
