## Post 16 Performance At An All Time High

As you may be aware there a massive changes happening in Bryn Celynnog's Post 16 Provision. In 2023 a brand new 6th Form Block will be opened as well as a brand new sports facility. The number of students coming to Bryn Celynnog for their A Level and BTEC Level 3 courses will increase significantly and it is so encouraging to see that the provision at Bryn Celynnog for post 16 students is of the very first class. The whole staff team strives tirelessly to give the students the best possible outcomes as they progress toward higher or further education or the world of work.

Results at Bryn Celynnog this year were outstanding, and were by far the best that we have ever had.

Overall a massive 51.8% of entries achieved grades  $A^*-A$ , 89.7% of entries achieved  $A^*-C$  grades, and 100%  $A^*-E$  grades. These are easily the strongest results in our history.

We are simply overwhelmed with the amazing achievements of our students this year. These include a large number of exceptional performances, including:

Caitlyn McKenzie Stephens and Jaydyn Young achieved four A\* grades.

Ffion Harris achieved 3 A\* grades

Amelia Brunt, Alana Worth and Lewis each achieved 2 A\* and 2 A grades

Headteacher Debra Baldock stated: "The 2022 results represent the strongest set of results in our history. This cohort has succeeded despite the massive challenges posed by the pandemic over the past couple of years. Their achievements are the culmination of many years of determined study, backed up with the support and expertise of our hard-working, highly caring and professional staff. Our ethos of nurturing success at Bryn Celynnog, along with focus on developing resilience and sheer hard work, has succeeded in producing outstanding results for our learners. These results set us in good stead on our journey to become a Centre of Excellence for Sixth Form provision in the local community.

We, along with many other schools in the area, checked in and were instantly greeted by live music, performed by the students of RWCMD, as well as other organisations such as Kinetic Musical Theatre and Coleg y Cymoedd. These performances varied in genre, beginning with a musical theatre piece, followed by a selection of student bands. They continued throughout the day, and were possibly my favourite aspect of the trip - seeing how the students were so talented and performed so confidently, it was so absorbing!

The main aspect of the trip was the considerable number of stalls spread around the college. From architecture, musical theatre, to photography - there was truly someone from every part of the arts. The stalls were extremely interesting, handing out leaflets and showing examples of the industry. The BBC were there, along with companies running apprenticeships! Speaking to the people working on each stall was enlightening, especially because they were mostly young people who are still in the education system themselves. We were able to enquire about universities and college courses we can take to further our education in the arts, and talk to students who were currently enrolled on them, what to expect, what they enjoyed and how to apply. We also spoke to many people who run or participated in extra-curricular activities in the arts, specifically things surrounding theatre, dance, and music. For example, Rubicon dance studio; a dance organisation based in Cardiff. They showed us videos of past performances, as well as the classes they run. As people who enjoy dancing, it was so nice to see the number of opportunities there are in dance for young people. And we cannot forget the best part; the interactive stalls! There was a stall run by professional photographers, where you and a friend could practise photographing each other, as well as getting a picture together! It was so much fun, and we got to leave with printed professional photos that we can look back on and remember our day.


#### **UPDATE**, creative minds wanted!

## Velindre: Charity Links Continue

Last Wednesday, Bryn Celynnog welcomed Lucesca Walters, a Velindre representative, to talk to Year 9 about the fundraising that they are involved in this year. 'Velindre fundraising' is a charity organisation that raises money to help provide specialist cancer services to over 1.5 million people in South East Wales. Last year, Bryn Celynnog's Year 9 pupils took part in a challenge along with 6 other schools to raise money for Velindre as part of their skills lessons. Altogether, the 6 schools raised a total of £10,386.34, £774 of that being raised by Bryn Celynnog. This year we are 1 of 10 schools involved in raising money for the charity as Year 9 are challenged once again to create a product or service in teams to raise funds or awareness for Velindre. The money that Velindre raises goes directly to the cancer centre in Cardiff to fund roles, machinery and research. Events such as bike rides, swims and runs helped Velindre raise an incredible £38 million last year. ## ClassCharts

#### **Pupil Accounts**

Pupils have been given access to their own account, which they will be able to log into via a computer/mobile phone app or by speaking with their Form Tutor.

Once a pupil has logged into their account they will be able to see their behaviour points and have access to the Reward Store, where they can purchase rewards online with the positive points they have collected.

#### **Rewards Store**

Rewards are an acknowledgement of pupils' hard work and effort both in the classroom and around the school. There is a constant expectation that all pupils will be praised and rewarded. Pupils will be notified when they receive positive points by their classroom teacher and can monitor their score via the ClassCharts website or App. Positive points also link directly to the Rewards Store in ClassCharts. Pupils can purchase their chosen item from the app and collect it in school. The current list of available items is listed in the Rewards Store.

#### **Parent Account**

Every child has a unique access code, please use this code to create an account by going to the website below:

or alternatively you can search your app store to download the ClassCharts app free of charge. Once on the ClassCharts website/app we advise that you listen to the short tutorial to assist you in logging in.
