Senior Rugby v Merthyr College

This was the Senior Rugby team's second match of the season and it was a tough assignment to travel to The Wern to face the Merthyr College team.

The atmospheric conditions had improved throughout the day and at KO the sun shone and a light breeze favoured the Bryn Celynnog/Y Pant team as they received the first kick of the game.

The visitors, comprised mainly of Year 11 students, faced an older and bigger team but were not overawed in any respect.

The early exchanges saw the Bryn/Y Pant team pressing with strong carrying and good passing movements. The defence was resolute though and Merthyr repelled all attacks. The hosts enjoyed their turn of possession and their heavier pack of forwards made

ground steadily. The onslaught continued until the defence was breached and Merthyr took the lead. They scored a second from a charged down kick ahead and led by 10 points. Bryn/Y Pant did not let their heads drop though and another wave of attacks led to a penalty 10m from the Merthyr try line. A quick tap and go charge saw Dylan Barratt crashing over to score the first try for the visiting team. Another quickly taken penalty, this time on their own 22m line saw Bryn/Y Pant launch a scorching attack down the left-hand side. Luke Evans instigated the counter with a stylish burst to the half way line having sold a couple of outrageous dummies on the way, a well timed off-load sent Sam Cash-James down the touchline leaving the Merthyr defence in disarray, he almost made the try line but a cover tackler cut him off, however, a

classy lifted pass around the back of the last defender released Logan Whyman, who had run a superb support line, to ground the ball untouched for a breath-taking score. Ten all at half time was a fair reflection of the play.

The second half saw the breeze that had favoured Bryn Celynnog/Y Pant in the first half become a strong wind now at the back of the home team. Merthyr tightened their game plan in the second period and exploited their superior size and weight. Tremendous tackling from the lighter visiting pack

made it difficult for he College boys though. Twice they scored but twice Bryn/Y Pant managed to reply with some good passing to create another long range try spearheaded again by Sam Cash-James, who turned in a man of the match performance, and finished off again by Logan Whyman. A cheeky interception



try from Kyle Scudamore kept the visitors in the hunt. It was 24 all as the game entered the last 15 minutes. The closing stages were tough as the wind and the relentless carrying of the Merthyr College forwards finally took its toll on the young Bryn/Y Pant outfit. Twice more they breached the line of defence but there was still fight in the visiting team and there were a few attacks in the dying moments from Bryn/Y Pant. Sadly, one such attack faltered and the loose ball was seized to afford Merthyr College a try with the last play of the game which resulted in a 41-24 victory for the hosts. The Bryn Celynnog/Y Pant team should hold their heads high after a very good performance against a strong team. There are greater things to come for this team, da iawn fechgyn.

ClassCharts

Pupil Accounts

Pupils have been given access to their own account, which they will be able to log into via a computer/mobile phone app or by speaking with their Form Tutor.

Once a pupil has logged into their account they will be able to see their behaviour points and have access to the Reward Store, where they can purchase rewards online with the positive points they have collected.

Rewards Store

Rewards are an acknowledgement of pupils' hard work and effort both in the classroom and around the school. There is a constant expectation that all pupils will be praised and rewarded. Pupils will be notified when they receive positive points by their classroom teacher and can monitor their score via the ClassCharts website or App. Positive points also link directly to the Rewards Store in ClassCharts. Pupils can purchase their chosen item from the app and collect it in school. The current list of available items is listed in the Rewards Store.

Parent Account
