

# Children In Need Fundraiser

On the **18<sup>th</sup> of November**, the Head Team have planned a fundraiser for Children in Need and Victory For Velindre.

Victory For Velindre is a charity raising money for Velindre Cancer Centre in Cardiff. The WJEC have developed the Victory for Velindre Skills Challenge for the Welsh Baccalaureate, where students develop a product and fundraise to support the Velindre Cancer Charity. Pupils at Bryn Celynnog have participated in the challenge, raising £770 in the last school year. The Head Team hope to hold more fundraisers for this amazing charity, as the money raised will impact people in the local community. A "Just Giving" page for the school will be set up on the Velindre website within the coming weeks, where online donations can be made directly to the charity.

#### The money raised will be split evenly between the two charities.

To raise money, there will be a bake sale, running at both break and lunch time. Years 7, 8 and 9 will be able to buy cakes outside of main canteen, Years 10 and 11 in technology (near baguette bar) and Sixth Formers up in the Sixth Form study area. To ensure there is enough cake for everyone, donations of **store-bought products** are welcomed. Donations can be dropped off to the Sixth Form or Mrs Thomas' classroom, H1.

For Years 7 to 11 it is non-school uniform. For the Sixth Form it is also non-school uniform, however, they have the option to wear pyjamas or comfy clothing.

Only the top scoring pupils in the country are awarded certificates of gold, silver or bronze. All pupils at Bryn Celynnog have access to the latest Microsoft Office applications as well as other cloud-based services. Microsoft Office 365 is your Office in the cloud! It will allow you to create, collaborate, edit, communicate and save school work as well as homework on your online space.

You will be able to access work on a range of devices, including PCs, laptops, tablets and smart phones. Microsoft 365 can be accessed at home, in school or on the go, provided you have an internet connection. All students have been invited to a <u>Microsoft Team</u> for each of their subject areas. Teams is used primarily as a communication channel but will also house learning resources and allow teachers to set assignments and homework.

## **ClassCharts**

#### **Pupil Accounts**

Pupils have been given access to their own account, which they will be able to log into via a computer/mobile phone app or by speaking with their Form Tutor.

Once a pupil has logged into their account they will be able to see their behaviour points and have access to the Reward Store, where they can purchase rewards online with the positive points they have collected.

#### **Rewards Store**

Rewards are an acknowledgement of pupils' hard work and effort both in the classroom and around the school. There is a constant expectation that all pupils will be praised and rewarded. Pupils will be notified when they receive positive points by their classroom teacher and can monitor their score via the ClassCharts website or App. Positive points also link directly to the Rewards Store in ClassCharts. Pupils can purchase their chosen item from the app and collect it in school. The current list of available items is listed in the Rewards Store.
