As you are aware, a brand new sixth form block is currently being built on our school site, along with new sports facilities and improved 21st Century classrooms for pupils in Key Stages 3, 4 and 5.

Work started on site in August 2022 and is currently on schedule to welcome sixth form pupils, including those from Pontypridd and Hawthorn High Schools, in September 2023. Construction of the steel frame for the new school building is an important landmark in the construction process, and this has recently been completed. On Tuesday 15th November, the contractor ISG invited pupils, staff and Cllr Rhys Lewis to see the progress, and they took the opportunity to sign a steel frame to mark the milestone.

On Wednesday 9th November, our Year 13 Law class visited Cardiff Crown Court to witness cases and interview staff such as judges, barristers and court clerks. This was a highly anticipated opportunity that the whole class is grateful for. Before we began, we had a tour with Josh, a clerk, exploring a few of the many rooms the court has. We then witnessed a number of cases, with Lucy, a member of the CPS guiding us as to which cases would be the most fascinating. These included a drug, theft and murder case. Perhaps the most shocking and gripping case was the murder trial where the defendant was accused of lighting a caravan on fire, causing the victim to have serious burns and as a result died.

On Wednesday the 9th of November, we visited Cardiff Crown Courts to get an insight into how trial processes work. One of the Clerks Josh began by giving us a tour of the courts. Walking into the courts for the first time was surreal, it was like something out of a crime documentary! We then listened to a Drug Conspiracy case where the Jury was sworn in and then proceeded to give their verdict on the case. Following this, we sat in on a Theft case, where the barristers were debating if bail should be granted. The most exciting part of the day was when we were then given the chance to listen to a number of witnesses give their first account of what happened

in a Murder Trial! A pathologist and 3 police officers proceeded to give their witness statements and we also listened a range of text messages from the suspect to the victim which were vital evidence in the trial. Even though the courts seemed like a frightening setting, we spoke to lots of different judges and barristers who all made us feel comfortable and educated us on lots of different aspects of court trials. Wednesday November 9th the Year 13 Law class visited Cardiff Crown Court. It was an incredible trip, we got to go on an exclusive tour and saw rooms unavailable to the public such as the Sheriffs Room and the Library. The tour was fantastic, we got to absorb the history of the legal system and sit in on high energy trials and watch the professionals at work. We sat in on a drug trial, where the defendant pled not guilty to being a part of a massive conspiracy throughout the UK creating hundreds of thousands of pounds worth of drugs. The judge talked to us about his role and explained all the evidence in the case. We also sat in on a murder case. It's fair to say the whole day was full of excitement and enlightenment.



BIMA Digital Day

BIMA is the British Interactive Technologies Association and is a driving force in the development of Digital Technology. Its goal, via the Digital Days, is to give 11-16 year olds an insight into a world of digital careers. Students compete in a sponsored, nationwide digital challenge for a chance to win £500 cash for their school and some fantastic prizes for themselves.

On the 9th of November the Year 10 Computer Science students took part in the first round of the BIMA Digital Day Nationwide Challenge. The aim of the challenge was to give students an insight into the world of digital careers and give them some experience of how the digital development cycle might work.

The students had the choice of two product briefs to work through from the Royal Mail and Primark. Utilizing the guidance and expertise from our digital partners Spindogs, who are a digital transformation agency based in Cardiff, the students first spent the morning conducting market research in groups of four based on their chosen brief.

The second part of the session was based around design. After taking in the information gathered during the market research, they were tasked with creating a concept of a digital design, whether that was an app or improvement to the website alongside some form of improved advertising. In the final part of the day the four groups presented their projects to the team from Spindogs using a 'Dragons Den' style format to see who the winner from the day was. The project of the winning team will be entered into the National competition with the overall winners due to be announced in February next year.

Despite the excellent work of all four groups during the day there could, however, only be one winner, that being the team known as "The Productive Posties" made up of Elizabeth Meredith, Drystan Jones, Clara Jones and James Beynon. Well Done! Now to look forward to the result of the National competition.










Bryn Celynnog has a tradition of producing excellent Public Speaking teams. You could be the next orator to represent Bryn.

ClassCharts

Pupil Accounts

Pupils have been given access to their own account, which they will be able to log into via a computer/mobile phone app or by speaking with their Form Tutor.

Once a pupil has logged into their account they will be able to see their behaviour points and have access to the Reward Store, where they can purchase rewards online with the positive points they have collected.

Rewards Store

Rewards are an acknowledgement of pupils' hard work and effort both in the classroom and around the school. There is a constant expectation that all pupils will be praised and rewarded. Pupils will be notified when they receive positive points by their classroom teacher and can monitor their score via the ClassCharts website or App. Positive points also link directly to the Rewards Store in ClassCharts. Pupils can purchase their chosen item from the app and collect it in school. The current list of available items is listed in the Rewards Store.

Parent Account

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Office 365
