Our special guest, Francis Hunt, who is software engineer, Maths teacher, researcher at Cambridge University, lecturer at University of South Wales... just to mention a few of his roles, has taken on this third Royal Institution session with our Year 6 students.

This time, they have been learning about coding and cryptology. All students were busy, studying the Caesar Cipher. The Caesar Cipher is a monoalphabetic substitution cipher, where each letter is replaced by another letter located a little further in the alphabet. The students absolutely loved decoding text and making their own secret messages.

We would like to thank the Royal Institution for giving us the opportunity to host these sessions, and special thanks to Francis for leading the fun and inspiring coding lesson.

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MAT Masterclasses

The Mathematics Department welcomed groups of Year 6 pupils from our cluster primary schools to take part in Maths Masterclasses supported by The Royal Institution, an independent charity dedicated to connecting people to the world of science.

In the pupils first workshop we investigated the interesting



behaviour of the Möbius Band which is caused by these two properties; a Möbius Band has only one face and one side which means you can draw a line between any two points on the band without



crossing over the edge and going against everyone's intuition, the Möbius Band

will not split into two pieces when cut in half length-ways. The pupils had great fun making Möbius bands out of strips of paper, then exploring and dissecting them to investigate their extraordinary mathematical properties. In the second workshop we explored parabolic curves.



This involves using straight lines to create more complex, curved diagram that gives a 3D effect. We then kicked off the holiday season by physically



stitching these designs into Christmas card.

The Year 6 pupils were wonderful and will be a welcomed addition to Bryn Celynnog next September.

Pupil Accounts

Pupils have been given access to their own account, which they will be able to log into via a computer/mobile phone app or by speaking with their Form Tutor.

Once a pupil has logged into their account they will be able to see their behaviour points and have access to the Reward Store, where they can purchase rewards online with the positive points they have collected.

Rewards Store

Rewards are an acknowledgement of pupils' hard work and effort both in the classroom and around the school. There is a constant expectation that all pupils will be praised and rewarded. Pupils will be notified when they receive positive points by their classroom teacher and can monitor their score via the ClassCharts website or App. Positive points also link directly to the Rewards Store in ClassCharts. Pupils can purchase their chosen item from the app and collect it in school. The current list of available items is listed in the Rewards Store.
