



	<p>Nineteen Eighty-Four by George Orwell</p> <p>The Thought Police, Doublethink, Newspeak, Big Brother – 1984 itself: these terms and concepts have moved from the world of fiction into our everyday lives. They are central to our thinking about freedom and its suppression; yet they were newly created by George Orwell in 1949 as he conjured his dystopian vision of a world where totalitarian power is absolute.</p>	<p>Classics</p>

	<p>Animal Farm by George Orwell</p> <p>Mr Jones of Manor Farm is so lazy and drunken that one day he forgets to feed his livestock. Vowing to eliminate the terrible inequities of the farmyard, the renamed Animal Farm is organised to benefit all who walk on four legs. 	<p>Lord of the Flies by William Golding</p> <p>A plane crashes on a desert island. The only survivors are a group of schoolboys. By day, they discover fantastic wildlife and dazzling beaches, learning to survive; at night, they are haunted by nightmares of a primitive beast. 	<p>Maze Runner Series by James Dashner</p> <p>When the lift cranks open, the only thing Thomas remembers is his first name. But he's not alone - an army of boys welcomes him to the Glade, an encampment at the centre of a terrible maze. The Gladers have no idea why they're there, or what's happened to the world outside. But following the arrival of a girl with a message, they must find a way out - or die.</p>	<p>Adventure / Thriller</p>
	<p>Fake by Ele Fountain</p> <p>Imagine a world where your only friends are virtual, and big tech companies control access to food, healthcare and leisure.
